COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS 1964.

The attention of junior members of the academic staff is drawn to the availability of these awards for which they are eligible. Under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan various Governments within the Commonwealth are providing fellowships and scholarships, mainly for post-graduate study, tenable in their countries by men and women students from other parts of the Commonwealth. Under the Plan over a thousand such awards are available, 500 of which are tenable in Britain. The Scholarships aim at providing opportunities for Commonwealth students normally resident in other countries to pursue advanced courses or undertake research. They are intended for persons of high intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to life in their own countries on their return from study abroad. They are primarily available for postgraduate study or research at universities and at colleges of technology, but may be held for courses at other institutions, e.g., in the fields of adult, social or rural education, of fine art, or architecture, or of industrial design. The Scholarships are open to both men and women who will not have reached their 35th birthday by 1 October, 1964.
