<u>Chemistry & Physics block at Ilam.</u> The Acting Vice-Chancellor reported that the slow rate of progress being made by the Contractors, the W. Williamson Construction Company Ltd., on the large Chemistry and Physics Block at Ilam was causing the University concern, especially as the Contractors had now undertaken a big building project at Lake Manapouri. A letter had been received from the Commissioner of Works enclosing a copy of a letter which he had sent to the Williamson Construction Company expressing disapproval, and warning them of the consequences of not completing the contract on time.

<u>Mobil Computer</u>. The report of the Mobil Computer Laboratory for the month of July showed that the total productive hours had again risen to a record of 555.35, or an average daily rate, calculated on a 7-day week, of 17 hours 55 minutes.

<u>Professor J.G.A. Pocock</u> has been invited to deliver two courses of lectures during the 1964 Summer Session at Columbia University, New York.

Visit of Dr E.C. Large. It is hoped that Dr E.C. Large of the Plant Pathology Laboratory of the Ministry of Agriculture, Harpenden, Herts., will be visiting the University in March, 1964. Dr R.E.F. Matthews is now unable to come. Dr Large is a well-known mycologist, author of "The Advance of the Fungi" and is currently working on plant disease measurement, surveying and forecasting.
